

PROJECT SUMMARY

The Nature Conservancy and partners will work across 11 counties in three Appalachian states to produce a nature-based tourism asset map and inventory, and a prioritized list of outdoor recreation infrastructure upgrades, which span across the tri-state Cumberland-Pine Mountain. Because this tri-state area lacks an integrated approach that collectively identifies and prioritizes regional infrastructure investments, The Nature Conservancy will support the advancement of outdoor recreation-based economic development through intentional coordination with local community organizations, as well as state, federal and nonprofit partners.

The Nature Conservancy and partners bring a combined \$135,000 in matching funds to this project. The project will result in the creation of one plan over the course of the 12-month performance period.
